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Temple Day : Banteay Prei

The road around to Preah Khan is closed for roadworks, so we were diverted along a well made dirt road (Plow Dey Grohom... which means red dirt road).

Banteay Prei is just north of Preah Khan and is a neat temple complex in quite a large "garden", fenced in with laterite walls. There were two other tourists there (who didn't even go inside the main temple walls).



They are working on the eastern entrance to Banteay Prei, excavating and repairing and rebuilding the eastern gopura.




