And then spent the day working on blogs, sewing (lining the bag), and doing my exercises and swimming. I have to work on that too (cannot do 30 laps now!)


Monday May 5th, 2025.

Once again, we were growled at by a dog, but it eventually accepted us.


It is very hot and sweaty. We are not used to it.
