There is still housework though! And I had to bring the washing inside due to showers.


There was very heavy rain over night (and thunder) overnight and in the early morning the "Mao" frogs were croaking their best.

Brilliant orange on the other side of their wings.




Here is a long-jawed golden orb spider (minus a few legs). Her body is about 6cm long.


(Nephila spp.)

And the seeds to sprout.




Looking through the East Gopura to Ta Nei Temple.

Temple Day: Palilay


Another good temple to visit on these very hot and sweaty mornings is Palilay, as it is well shaded too.




A guard lion at the terrace to the west of Palilay.



The frangipanis are blooming.




The central tower (lopsided where some stones have fallen) still standing on the tall sandstone base.




As usual, we were accompanied by a dog (or two) on our walk around this temple.
