


Friday May 23rd, 2025.


It doesn't seem that long ago we planned our retirement to Cambodia in a pizza restaurant!

**Temple Day: Neak Poan**

This is the last pool they were working on. You can see the replaced sandstone blocks in the steps.




The pools are connected by these carved sandstone arches.

## The temple is built on an island in the East Baray.




This is the laterite landing stage (facing north).




Looking from the wooden pathway at the landing stage and in towards the central temple.
